Summer is here! NCDI celebrates our 15th anniversary this year. We would like to share a few updates on our studio, alumni, teachers and our upcoming important dates. We are very proud of our reputation, the success of our former students, and the involvement of our teachers in the community. Congratulations to our NCDI alumni who have continued to pursue their passions for dance. Robert Hartwell is performing with the National Tour of *Motown* and has created the new national musical theatre workshop called *The Broadway Dance Collective*. Grady Bowman was last seen in the Broadway hit *Honeymoon in Vegas* starring Tony Danza, and he is now the Associate Director for Chris Gatelli's new pre-Broadway production of *In Your Arms*. Emily Nicolaou is touring the world dancing with the Danish Dance Theatre. Lindsey Matheis is dancing with the cutting edge dance company BODYTRAFFIC, based in California. All of these NCDI alumni also trained at the University of North Carolina School of the Arts. As a

graduate of UNCSA and a former honorary member of the UNCSA Board of Trustees, I know these students receive outstanding training. Congratulations to NCDI dancers Eli Hooker who graduated from UNCSA and Dylan Parton who continues in the BFA Contemporary Dance Program. Several of our students attended the UNCSA Festival of Dance in February. Congratulations to our dancers who have been accepted to the UNCSA Summer Commercial Dance Intensive.

This spring our dancers were busy in school musicals throughout the triangle, and Victoria Moore performed in Theatre Raleigh's *The Wolf*. In May, several talented NCDI young dancers were selected to perform in Carolina Ballet's *Midsummer Night's Dream*. In April, Kirstie was honored to be selected to teach contemporary jazz classes at SERBA where 450 dancers from the southeast participated. Kirstie will also return to the guest faculty for the Carolina Ballet's Summer Intensive. Ronnie West traveled to China as an Arts Ambassador for the US State Department. His dance company, Black Irish, will be performing this June, and Ronnie continues to push the boundaries of cutting edge dance in the triangle. - June 13-July 23, our 6-week summer session: We offer daytime/evening dance classes for ages 3 to adults and summer dance camps/intensives for beginners to the serious dancers. - August 1: The 2016-17 dance year begins. Enrollment opened May 23.
